The topic of the seminar is: Hidden in Plain Sight: Influential Sets in Linear Regression

Abstract

Influential sets are sets of observations that have considerable impact on econometric results. In this paper, we present a disciplined and insightful method for assessing the sensitivity of regressionbased inference to influential sets. We explore algorithmic approaches to identify influential sets, discuss interpretation, and assess the sensitivity of earlier studies to these sets. We apply our method to some established empirical results in development economics, and show that these are impacted by influential sets of small size. Identifying and analyzing these sets can reveal potential omitted variable bias, unobserved heterogeneity, a lack of external validity, and technical limitations of the methodological approach used.
